August 26th-28th Travel to Guilin, **Guilin** is a prefecture-level city in China, situated in the northeast of the Guangxi Zhuang Autonomous Region on the west bank of the Li River. Its name means "forest of **Sweet Osmanthus**", owing to the large number of fragrant Sweet *Osmanthus* trees located in the city. The city has long been renowned for its unique scenery.

August 28th-31st Travel to Fujian – it is a province on the southeast coast of China . Fujian borders Zhejiang to the north, Jiangxi to the west, and Guangdong to the south ... Southern Shaolin Temple is located here as well as the WuYi Mountains. Numerous types of tea are produced around Mount Wuyi; it is the origin of the *real* Da Hong Pao tea and Lapsang souchong,

September 1st Travel to Shenzhen, Shenzhen's novel and modern cityscape is the result of the vibrant economy made possible by rapid foreign investment since the late 1970s, when it was a small fishing village. Since then, foreign nationals have invested more than US\$30 billion for building factories and forming joint ventures. It is now reputedly one of the fastest growing cities in the world.^[1] Being southern mainland China's major financial centre, Shenzhen is home to the Shenzhen Stock Exchange as well as the headquarters of numerous high-tech companies. Shenzhen is also the second busiest port in mainland China, ranking only after Shanghai. A great place to shop!
